TAN AH TAH – SAWL SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE PHYSICALLY DISABLED

This Scholarship was founded in memory of the late The Honourable Mr Justice Tan Ah Tah. The Singapore Association of Women Lawyers (SAWL) raised the initial capital for the Fund.

The Tan Ah Tah-SAWL Scholarship Fund (“the Fund”) was established by SAWL in December 1987 and it awards scholarships to physically disabled students annually. The students are from secondary schools to tertiary institutions who demonstrate both financial need and academic promise.

All the trustees are unpaid volunteers and apart from audit fees and nominal expenses, all the monies collected are used to award scholarships to needy physically disabled students.

In recent years, the Fund receives yearly, an average of about 30 to 40 applicants and the Fund awards yearly scholarships amounting to about \$40,000 to \$50,000.

The Fund has IPC status - all donations are tax deductible.
